**Context:** Shared writing of a report in science.

- **Teacher:** Now, if you're not sure how to write "aerosol", there are some things that can help you. Can you see if you can come up with some other suggestions?
- **Student 1:** We thought, there's "aero" in "aeroplane".
- Teacher: OK, so you do know what "aero" means.
- Student 2: It sounds like "air".
