“No friends here,” said Damon.

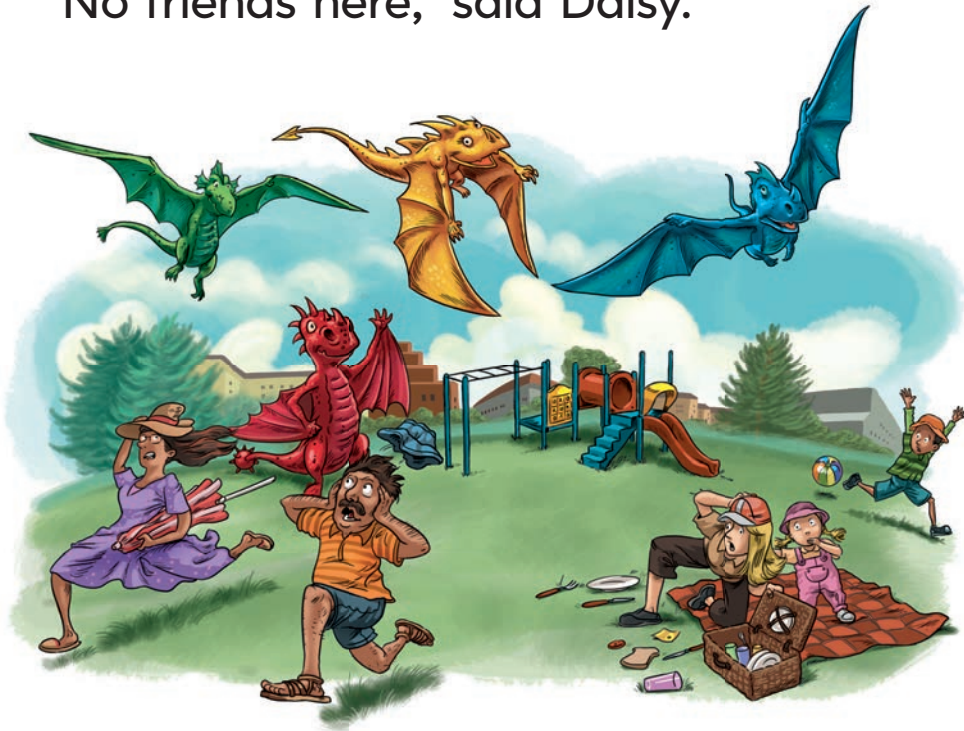


The dragons swooped down

The sausages sizzled.

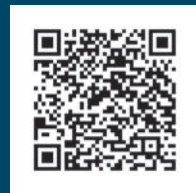
“Welcome to our barbecue,”
